**Mario Cimoli**, from Argentina, is the Deputy Executive Secretary of the UN Economic Commission for Latin America and the Caribbean (ECLAC). He was appointed in that position on August 1st, 2018. He also holds the position of Director of the Division of Production, Productivity and

Management and Officer-in-Charge of the Division of International Trade and Integration.

He has been appointed as co-director (with Giovanni Dosi and Joseph Stiglitz) of two task forces (Industrial Policy and Intellectual Property Rights Regimes for Development) of the Initiative for Policy Dialogue of the Columbia University (New York).

A PhD in economics from the University of Sussex, his research deals with development paths, economic growth and its relationship with the productive structure, and international trade. His work examines the interconnections between industrial policy, technological development and innovation.
